

11th JUDICIAL CIRCUIT OF ILLINOIS
ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 2020 – 14

WHEREAS, in response to the global Covid-19 pandemic, the 11th Judicial Circuit entered Administrative Orders, with supplements, relating to, among other things, continuing trials and juvenile delinquency proceedings pursuant to Orders entered by the Illinois Supreme Court Illinois in M.R. 30370;


WHEREAS, the Illinois Supreme Court entered the latest Order in M.R. 30370 on April 7th, 2020 providing, among other things, that Chief Judges of each circuit may continue trials until further order of this Court and also provided additional rationale and basis for continuing trials;

WHEREAS, by virtue of prior 11th Judicial Circuit Administrative Orders, all trials and juvenile proceedings currently scheduled until May 1st, 2020 have been continued. The continuance date of May 1st, 2020 remains in place, subject to change based on a variety of factors including, but not limited to, the State of Illinois Shelter in Place Order that currently expires on April 30th, 2020;

WHEREAS, Chief Judge Mark A. Fellheimer finds that the April 7th, 2020 Illinois Supreme Court Order M.R. 30370 and all prior Orders entered in Illinois Supreme Court Order M.R. 30370 should be adopted by the 11th Judicial Circuit as it relates to the rationale and basis as stated by the Illinois Supreme Court for continuing 11th Judicial Circuit trials and juvenile proceedings during the Covid-19 pandemic.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, all Orders entered in Illinois Supreme Court Order M.R. 30370 are hereby adopted by the 11th Judicial Circuit and are hereby incorporated by reference to all 11th Judicial Circuit Administrative Orders entered in relation to the Covid-19 pandemic.
