Dear Court Stakeholders,

The Illinois Supreme Court Commission on Access to Justice is pleased to announce that we have published the much-anticipated Cannabis Expungement suite of forms. The revised forms can be [found here](#) and include the following:

- 1) Getting Started Motion to Vacate & Expunge Eligible Cannabis Convictions
- 2) How to Vacate & Expunge Eligible Cannabis Convictions
- 3) Motion to Vacate & Expunge Eligible Cannabis Convictions
- 4) Additional Cannabis Convictions
- 5) Notice of Court Date for Motion to Vacate & Expunge Eligible Cannabis Convictions
- 6) Additional Notice of Court Date for Motion to Vacate & Expunge Eligible Cannabis Convictions
- 7) Order Granting or Denying Motion to Vacate & Expunge Eligible Cannabis Convictions

**Please also be informed that we have discontinued the Interpreter Request and Order** as a statewide standardized form, so it is no longer required for distribution or dissemination under Rule 10-101. However, there is still an interpreter request document that litigants can use. It can be found at: <https://www.illinoiscourts.gov/public/find-a-language-interpreter>

As a final note, since the Rule 10-101 change is now in effect, we are providing a few reminders for best practices as courts seek to maintain compliance. While the pace of updates will be intermittent, we are always updating forms to ensure legal sufficiency. Over the next several months there will be occasional updates released, including several to Family Law forms coming soon. When updating your forms resources, be sure to:

- Post links to the fillable forms fresh from the Supreme Court's new website (<https://www.illinoiscourts.gov/documents-and-forms/approved-forms/>). This will ensure the connectivity of the link to the most up to date forms.
- Print forms for court users "on-demand" as much as possible to save printing costs.
- Email [jputnam@illinoiscourts.gov](mailto:jputnam@illinoiscourts.gov) to check for potential updates to forms before making any large printing orders.
